HOW WOULD YOUR LIFE BE DESCRIBED?

A hundred years from now when someone examines our life, how would they describe us? We look back in history and recall the great military leaders or inventors. When we talk about these people, we dwell on their abilities as leaders or thinkers. We talk about their deeds, leadership, and heroism.

As I thought about how we talk about people in the past, I found something missing in our discussions. No one is discussing whether they were faithful to God. You would think this would be the most important part of the discussion. Regardless of how good a leader these people were or how many wonderful things they invented, if they were not right spiritually, then the rest does not matter.

So, thinking about our own lives, how will we be

remembered? Will we be like those we talk about who are only remembered for some deed or invention? Or, will we be remembered as one faithful to God, who walked in the light?

Consider a couple of examples for us from the Bible. When you and I think about Job, we think of his patience. When we think about Noah, we think about the Ark and his obedience to God. Think about how they are described to us by God.

1. "and that man was perfect, and upright, and one that feared God, and eschewed evil" (Job 1:1)
2. "Noah was a just man, and perfect in his generation, and Noah walked with God" (Gen. 6:9)

What did Job do for a living? What position in life did he hold? Was he involved in politics? In truth, we know little or nothing about these things, but we do know of his faithfulness to God.

What did Noah do for a living? How wealthy was he? Again, we do not know anything about these things, but we do know how faithful he was to God.

What will people remember about our faithfulness to God? Do they even know we are faithful to God? What will they remember about us?

A hundred years from now when some examines our lives will they conclude that we were faithful to God? Will they see in our records one who attended all the services, one who studied and taught the Bible, one who hated and stayed away from evil, and one who lived godly and pure lives?

Let us be like Job and Noah and be recognized by God as faithful men and women.
